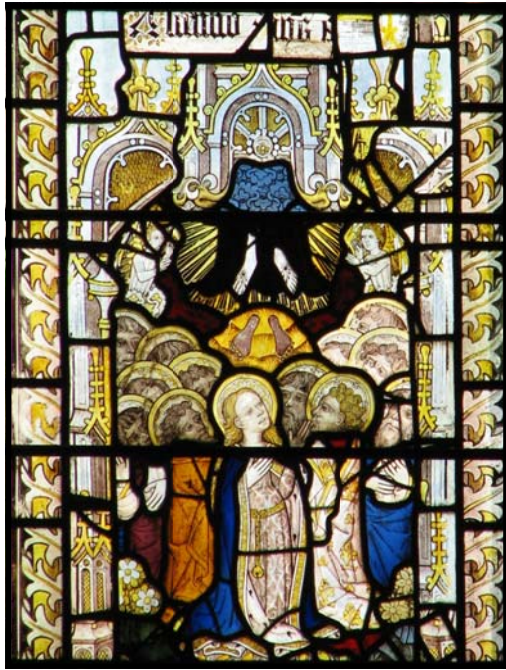
The Friends

The Friends are a Registered Charity and their objective is to assist the Rector and the Parochial Church Council in the preservation and maintenance of the fabric and furnishings of the Church.

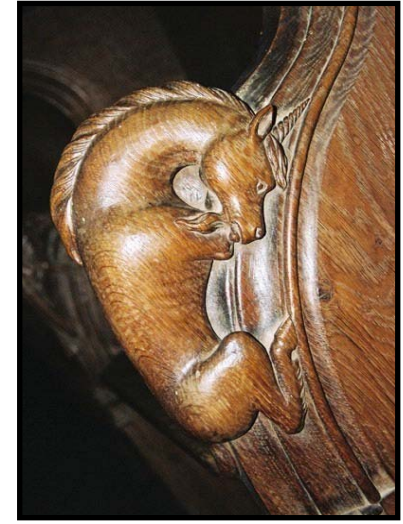


St Peter and St Paul, East Harling is a magnificent church of national importance. In his book "England's Thousand Best Churches", Simon Jenkins states the tower "looks as if it has been telescoped into its base to avoid a thunderstorm" and refers to the church interior as being "rich in medieval art, notably the 15th Century glass in the magnificent east window".

The east window depicting the joys and sorrows of the virgin was donated to the Church by Lady Anne Herling and her second husband Sir Robert Wingfield circa 1460.
